In 2010 the School of Nursing came into existence with the Auxiliary Nurse Midwife (ANM) Course. Keeping in view the need of trained nurses In 2011 the School of Nursing started with General Nursing and midwifery (GNM), Diploma in nursing with intake of 20 seats which was enhanced to the intake of 25 seats in the year 2013 an thereafter to 45 seats in the year 2022-23. To keep pace with the rapid advancement in Health and Nursing Sciences. The B.Sc. Nursing Degree Course of Four years duration with intake of 40 was started in 2013 which was enhanced to 60 in the year 2024. Post Basic B.Sc Nursing Degree course was started in the year 2023-24. All these courses started under MUHS. Maharashtra College of Nursing now stands as an Edifice of Enlightenment and Empathy. ADMINISTRATIVE AFFILIATIONS:

Maharashtra college of Nursing is affiliated to Maharashtra University of Health Sciences Nashik (MUHS) and recognized by Maharashtra Nursing Council and Indian Nursing Council.

ADMISSION & ORIENATION:

For the Academic year 2024-25, Total 55 students were enrolled for the B.Sc Nursing course in which 47 students were selected from CAP rounds and 08 students were selected from management/ NRI Quota. And for the P.B.B.Sc (N), Total 40 students were enrolled in which 34 students were selected from CAP rounds and 06 students were selected from management/ NRI Quota.

The students were welcomed and given campus orientation by their Class Coordinator. Orientation regarding Professional adjustment, value education, Discipline, Responsible citizenship, Healthy life style, self-defence and anti-ragging was given by faculty.

CULUM & ACADEMIC PROGRAMME:

Inhavative teaching methods are implemented in the teaching learning activities. Besides the regular theory classes, normally students are provided with a wide range of clinical experience in other reputed Hospitals and community health centres Students also go for observation visits to Leprosy hospital, De-addiction Centre, Rehabilitation centres, Home for the aged, special schools, Factories, water purification plant, sewage plant, milk and food processing units. Along with this practical experiences, Objective Structured Clinical examinations and lab classes are provided to the students by the faculty to excel in the practical skills in the current scenario. Mentoring and counselling were rendered regularly to each student to support them in their academics. Value added classes are provided to all the students as well as staff to inculcate values and ethics in their personal and professional life.
